

New Tours

41. Christmas Lights by road. We follow the Chanel 7 Christmas lights by luxury coach after a Buffet meal at the Bayswater Hotel or a multiple choice dinner at the Ye Olde Narrogin Inn or just enjoy the lights tour starting after dark. This tour is best after the 1st of December. **\$68** p/p or **\$38** p/p for lights tour only.

42. Bolgart Hotel. Today we travel to the wheat & sheep town of Bolgart, settled in the early 1840's, the name meaning magic swamp place, for lunch at the Hotel which was built in 1916. The Hotel has undergone a revamp and has a friendly atmosphere. We then visit the Bolgart Bell Tower which was built as a fun alternative to the Swan Bell Tower. The "tower" was built in 1999 and was opened by Richard Court. We will have morning tea at Noble Falls on the way to Bolgart. On our return we will have a spot of wine tasting at Koorinja Winery.

43. Museum and Honey Today we travel to the Brockman Centre in Bindoon where we have morning tea and with the volunteers we can enjoy the Museum contents. There is something for both girls & guys to see. We travel through Bindoon on our way to Little Eeden Honey farm for a delicious lunch and honey tasting. These gorgeous gardens have chickens, peacocks and ducks roaming free. After lunch we return home via the Swan Valley. **\$89** p/p

44. Patsy Durack Gardens. By request, this lovely tour has been added to our list. We start the day with a Cascade morning tea before visiting Patsy Durack gardens for a talk by Patsy Durack and a visit to the old Archbishop's residence which was built in 1915. These rose gardens are spectacular. (closed June to September) We then proceed to Golden Ponds for a delicious 3 course lunch, returning via Thomas Lee for strawberries. (seasonal) **\$85** p/p

45. Christmas lunch and Berry farm. After morning tea at North Dandalup Dam we proceed to Dwellingup to visit the amazing gift shop followed by lunch at the Dwellingup Hotel. After lunch we will stop at Vergone Orchard to pick your own berries and purchase fruit & cherries. We make our way home the scenic route. **\$93** p/p

46. Historical Northam. We stop at Lake Leschenaultia for morning tea. The lake was designated a World Heritage sight in 2005 and holds approximately 520 million litres of water. After morning tea we make our way to Northam where we will visit the historical Northam Railway Station where a member of the Historical Society will give an informed talk. After a delicious 2 course lunch at the Riverside Hotel we will have a member join us on board while we drive past Historical homes in Northam including the Old Northam Post Office, Mitchell House and the Old Flour Mill. On our way home we will have a stop at the famous Bakers Hill Pie Shop. **\$83** pp

47. Slater Homestead Goomalling. We start our day with morning tea at Noble Falls before driving through the beautiful country side to Goomalling where we enjoy a lovely 2 course lunch at the historical stone & mud brick homestead which was built in 1856. After lunch and a talk by the historian you will have free time to wander around this magnificent property before returning home via Toodyay. (April to October) **\$89** p/p

48. Museum of Pubs in Gidgegannup is our first stop where we will have Cascades morning tea then free time to explore the extensive displays in the Museum. We then travel to Bakers Hill to the **Summer Creek Estate** for a 2 course lunch. This is a family owned brewery and winery situated on a 98 acre heritage property. A very interesting talk will be given on the history of the property. Most of the produce is grown & produced on the property, including 15 bee hives. Numbers for lunch are preferred 7 days prior to our visit. On the return journey we will stop in Sawyers Valley at the Crystal shop or the huge Op shop. **\$85** p/p

49. Moore River by Road. Today we travel North to Moore River for morning tea before meeting our guide Phil Cook who will board the coach and take us around Guilderton. Phil is a full bottle on the history of the area and very passionate about sharing his knowledge with us. We then travel to the Seabird Tavern which overlooks the ocean for a lovely lunch. We return via the coast to see the new developments in and around Yanchep. **\$105 p/p**

50. Fairbridge Village was established in 1912 and was home to child migration and used as a training ground for the Woman's Land Army. We enjoy a Devonshire tea before an informative guided tour of the Village. Fairbridge Farm visit is an enjoyable tour. We then travel to Golden Ponds for a 3 course lunch before visiting Jadran Winery, time permitting. **\$89 p/p**

51. Rockingham Environmental Centre is run by volunteers who will give us a guided tour after a Cascade morning tea. Our visit will be supporting a wonderful centre which was opened in 2000 as an educational centre to enable a greater understanding of environmental issues and sustainable lifestyle choices. Lunch today will be at Pengos on the foreshore.. On our return we will have some free time on the Rockingham foreshore. **\$79 p/p**

52. Waroona Just a couple of hours south of Perth is the lovely town of Waroona which boasts some beautiful murals and an amazing lake. As we make our way South we stop in Pinjarra for a Cascade Tours morning tea and a look around the historic Edenvale. After morning tea we make our way to Waroona for an informative town tour including the site of the old Bonny's gardens then to lunch at the Rec Hotel. We then travel back to your pick up point. Enjoy a lovely day out of the city. **\$86 p/p**

53. Whitegum Farm. Just outside of York lies a 300 acre property like no other. After morning tea en route we travel via Greenhills to Whitegum Farm. This farm has a caravan park, 4 wheel drive track and the largest privately owned flight facility in WA. The bar and grill are second to none, full of character. The roast lunch is one of the best, followed by a lovely desert. Too much to mention but a MUST SEE venue. (minimum 30 passengers) We finish our day with a visit to the York Olive Oil Company for an ice cream. **\$89 p/p**

54. Quilts for Cancer/Comfort Quilts Northam. This is an amazing day out. Our morning tea stop is at Lake Leschenaultia. The lake was designated a World Heritage sight in 2005 and holds approximately 520 million litres of water. After morning tea we make our way to Northam where we will visit these amazing folks who make quilts to send to cancer sufferers. Bronwyn and the ladies are happy to show their work and answer your questions. After a delicious 2 course lunch at the Riverside Hotel we drive around Northam showing historical buildings in Northam including the Old Northam Post Office, Mitchell House and the Old Flour Mill. On our way home we will have a stop at the famous Bakers Hill Pie Shop. **\$83 pp**

55. Peel Manor is a magnificent venue. Peel Manor House is a Georgian Mansion nestled on 10.5 acres of manicured grounds. The inside of the venue welcomes guests in a VIP style dining room and function centre and serving a lovely 2 course lunch for us.

But first we will enjoy a Cascades morning tea at Kwinana Beach before taking a leisurely drive along the coast past the Kwinana Grain Terminal which was established in 1974. The holding capacity is over 1 million tonnes and the jetty where the grain is loaded on ships for export is also a macro dive sight. After lunch we call into a winery for tastings. **\$95p/p**

56. Yanchep Lavender Farm. Today our tour takes us to Neil Hawkins Park for morning tea then on to Two Rocks to spend a little time looking at carvings and the 10 meter high statue of King Neptune, the Roman God of the sea. After taking some time enjoying the fresh air and carvings we take the scenic drive to the Yanchep Lavender Farm for a really nice lunch, desert, tea or coffee. There is a small shop with lavender products and gifts. Karla & Gary have worked hard to establish this wonderful business and are happy to share their story with us.

After lunch we make our way back to your pick up point partially via the coast. **\$87p/p**

57. Ask us about the many venues for a Christmas or Christmas in July lunch including Yanchep Inn, Parkerville Tavern, Bolgart Hotel, Stringybark Winery, Summer Creek Estate and many, many more.

58. Local Wildflower day tours are also available, including King's Park, Wireless Hill, Chittering Valley, Bindoon, Gidgegannup, Morangup, Toodyay and many more. Of course Spring time is the best time.
